As part of a national bioterrorism protection plan, we are providing smallpox vaccinations for public health and hospital smallpox response teams. These teams are ready to investigate and control any potential smallpox outbreak.

We work closely with local doctors and hospitals to monitor the health of county residents. We provide doctors with the latest information on health conditions in our county. We also share important reports on current health issues and trends that affect our community.
