

2012 Atlantic County Teen Arts Festival

BASIC INFORMATION SHEET

The 2012 Teen Arts Festival will take place in the Art District of Hammonton, NJ. This includes the area of Bellevue Avenue, Second & Third Streets, & Vine Street (map will be provided). This new space requires additional regulations of participating students and schools.

- 1. IDENTIFICATION:** All students must wear their school identification badges while at the Festival.
- 2. CHAPERONES:** The organizers of the Festival will have volunteers on hand to assist but schools must also provide chaperones for the students - 2 per class/20 students.
- 3. SCHOOL APPLICATION/REGISTRATION:** Each school must complete an application and pay the Festival registration fee. **HOMESCHOOLED:** Students must register and pay a \$10 registration fee.
- 4. NO SMOKING:** The Festival is a NO SMOKING event.
- 5. DROP OFF AND PICK UP AT FESTIVAL:** All buses will drop off and pick up students at the designated location. (area tba)
- 6. SIGN-IN ON THE DAY OF EVENT:** A registration area will be set up under tents at the bus drop-off location. Teachers and chaperones are required to sign in and provide cell phone numbers for emergency contact. This location will also serve as the general information and lost and found area.
- 7. VENUES: 2012 Teen Arts Festival event venues in Hammonton will include but are not limited to:**

- 8. FOOD AND DRINK:** will be available at restaurants and cafes with the district. A list will be provided in the festival program. Rest areas with tables and chairs, and portable restroom facilities will be provided. Accessible restroom facilities are available at Eagle Theatre. **Note:** Students and teachers are expected TO REMAIN WITHIN THE ARTS DISTRICT at all times.
- 9. THIS IS A HIGH TRAFFIC AREA:** Students must obey all traffic rules at the Festival. Crossing is allowed only at designated crosswalks. Hammonton police department will be on hand to assist with pedestrian traffic issues.
